Guidelines for Assessing Construction of New College Buildings

June 09, 1998 Passed by the 2,059th Administrative Meeting

- Article 1 National Taiwan University (NTU or “the University”) formulates the NTU *Guidelines for Assessing Construction of New College Buildings* (“the Guidelines”) to provide budgeting guidelines for the construction of new college buildings.
- Article 2 For the purpose of the Guidelines, a “new college building” shall refer to a new structure that is in line with the University’s campus planning and the medium- to long-term development plan of the colleges.
- Article 3 A college that meets any of the following criteria may be given budgeting priority for the construction of new buildings:
1. The budget for the new building was completed by the University in accordance with applicable law prior to the formulation of the Guidelines.
 2. The existing building has been determined to be a safety concern by an expert.
 3. Renovation of the existing building may be conducted in conjunction with another unit’s renovation project to significantly improve public safety, public health, and the campus environment.
 4. The total floor area of the college’s existing buildings is less than 50% of the recommended floor area as calculated according to the standards set by the Ministry of Education in October 1996.
 5. The new building has a total floor area of at least 3,000 ping, and at least 50% of the total construction costs shall be covered by funds raised by the college itself. The percentage of self-raised funds may be lowered to 40% if the project involves the complete demolition of an old building to make way for new construction.
- Article 4 Matters not addressed herein shall be subject to other applicable regulations of the University.
- Article 5 The Guidelines shall be passed by the Administrative Meeting and then implemented. The same shall apply when amendments are made.
